

Man involved in murder surrenders

A car driver surrendered before a court in Vilathikulam in Tuticorin district on Thursday in connection with the murder of a businessman, reported in Pallikaranai on April 3. The man was identified as Murugesan, 52, a native of Tuticorin, claimed to have surrendered, as the Chennai city police personnel have been searching for him for the murder of one Sankaran. Following this, police personnel have approached the Vilathikulam court to allow them to inquire Murugesan in their custody. A hunt for the five others is on.

Man stabbed by friend in drunken brawl: A 40-year-old was stabbed by his friend in a drunken brawl at Kundrathur on Thursday night. Police identified the deceased as

Karthik of Duraisamy street. He was having a drink with his friend Shankar when a fight broke out and Shankar stabbed Karthik using a tube light. Police arrested Shankar.
